Children enjoy good health

More children enjoy better health. A total of 1,017 children joined the nutrition programme, focused on educating children as well as their mothers. Of that group, 844 passed their health check. Better sanitation in communities has lessened the risk of diseases and infections for 504 children from 844 families.

// Children are educated for life

Girls and boys have access to better education. A total of 325 boys and girls joined children's book clubs, improving their reading skills.

You-!n learn better hygiene habits. Sanitation classes for 3,452 students, including 1,672 girls from 8 primary schools, covered topics such as hygiene and latrine maintenance.
